

Josephine P. Dr. Briggs has published more than 175 research articles, book chapters, and other scholarly publications. She is an elected member of the Association of American Physicians and the American Society for Clinical Investigation and a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science. Peters Award and NIH Director's Awards for work on key trans-NIH activities such as leading the NIH Health Care Systems Research Collaboratory
